## UPPER OXFORD TOWNSHIP APRIL 10, 2017

Upper Oxford Township Board of Supervisors held their regular monthly meeting at the Township Building, 1185 Limestone Road, Russellville, PA on Monday, April 10, 2017 at 7:00 P.M.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, Scott Rugen.

After the Salute to the Flag, Scott Rugen led in prayer.

PUBLIC COMMENTS – Colin Kraucunas questioned the Supervisors on the article regarding septic pumping which was in the spring newsletter. Colin wanted to know if any decision was made regarding the years between required pump outs. Scott informed him that this ordinance is still in the draft process by the Township engineer.

WEBB ROAD BIDS – The Township received a grant to place material down on Webb Road which is presently a gravel road. Bids were duly advertised in the Daily Local News March 22<sup>nd</sup> and March 29, 2017. Two bids were received for this project.

BEN FISHER - LAND DEVELOPMENT PLAN - The applicant was seeking the following waivers as follows:

- Section 505 –Impact Studies

At the April 3, 2017 Planning Commission meeting, the Planning Commission recommended to the Board of Supervisors that the waivers be granted conditioned upon the applicant receiving an adequate NPDES permit letter. Since the NPDES permit was not yet received, the Supervisors will act on these waivers at a later date.

RON BEANS – Tax Parcel #57-4-85.8B, 148 Log House Road. Mr. Beans forwarded a Simplified Storm Water Plan for review. The Township Engineer has given his approval on this plan. After discussion, the Supervisors would like the Township Zoning Officer to re-visit this permit and the setback requirements.

AGRICULTURAL SECURITY AREAS – Our 7 year review is due this summer. Motion was made by Charles Fleischmann, seconded by Howard Reyburn and carried to authorize the Secretary to move forward with this fourth (4<sup>th</sup>) review of the Agricultural Security Areas and include the two recently submitted petitions presented by Elam and Elizabeth King and William and Louise Clark.

ENGINEER - The Supervisors reviewed the engineer's report.

WORK SESSION – A work session will be held April 24, 2017 to discuss riparian buffers and also international property code. Scott will ask Bill Beers to attend. The Supervisors would like the engineer, Ron Ragan to attend the May work session.

ADJOURNMENT – There being no further business, motion was made by Charles Fleischmann and carried unanimously to adjourn at 8:25 P.M.
